
is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 102 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 30 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 33); the figure for 1982 was 26 percent (national rank: 31)¹

TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION




COSTS

\$625 million⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 8.6 percent in fiscal year 20086
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Colorado spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 15 cents on probation and parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$76.51) = 6 days of parole or 21 days of probation⁵
