
is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 59 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 27 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 37); the figure for 1982 was 13 percent (national rank: 50)¹

TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION




COSTS

- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Connecticut spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 3 cents on parole⁵
