#### **POPULATION**

### 1 in 53 adults<sup>1,2</sup>

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 87 adults1,2
- **Percent behind bars:** at year end 2007, 44 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 9); the figure for 1982 was 23 percent (national rank: 38)1

• Share of general fund: 5.6 percent in fiscal year 2008<sup>6</sup>




