
is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 105 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 55 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 1); the figure for 1982 was 43 percent (national rank: 4)¹

TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION




COSTS

\$266 million⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 6.4 percent in fiscal year 2008⁶
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Mississippi spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 39 cents on probation and parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$35.69) = 27 days of probation and parole⁵
