
is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 184 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 43 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 10); the figure for 1982 was 25 percent (national rank: 33)¹

COSTS

\$101 million⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 6.8 percent in fiscal year 20086
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar New Hampshire spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 9 cents on probation and parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$89.73) = 42 days of probation and parole⁵
