#### **POPULATION**

### 1 in 53 adults<sup>1,2</sup>


is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 93 adults<sup>1,2</sup>
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 36 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 24); the figure for 1982 was 31 percent (national rank: 23)<sup>1</sup>

#### **TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION**





- Ratio of spending: For every dollar New York spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 12 cents on probation and parole<sup>5</sup>
