
is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 116 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 22 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 45); the figure for 1982 was 37 percent (national rank: 13)¹

COSTS

\$1.79 billion⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 7.3 percent in fiscal year 2008⁶
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Ohio spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 6 cents on parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$69.23) = 6 days of parole⁵
