
is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 74 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 25 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 42); the figure for 1982 was 24 percent (national rank: 35)¹

TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION




COSTS

\$763 million⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 10.6 percent in fiscal year 20086
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Oregon spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 27 cents on probation and parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$84.43) = 7 days of parole or 11 days of probation⁵
