
is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 128 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 40 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 15); the figure for 1982 was 39 percent (national rank: 10)¹

TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION




COSTS

\$103 million⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 5.7 percent in fiscal year 2008⁶
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Wyoming spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 23 cents on probation and parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$121.56) = 13 days of probation and parole⁵
