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Federal Level HIAs: Lessons Learned

The Value of HIAs within Federal Policy Context

- Brings a new frame of health to contentious policy debates
- Provides new data to help inform the policy conversation
- HIA process helps develop relationships:
 - Agency staff, policymakers, and legislative staff
 - Stakeholder and advocacy organizations

Lessons Learned: Adapting to Federal Policy Timeline and Context

- HIA on legislation has an unpredictable timeline
- Full, written policy to be assessed may not be available, necessitating changes in typical screening criteria
- Need to use communications and reporting strategies that may be atypical for HIA practice
- Understanding the politics and policy context is critical:
 - Use of policy analysis
 - Use of experts
 - Selection of project scope

Lessons Learned: Organizational Structure and Context of HIA Approach

- Alignment of HIA goals and organizational goals
- Need to be aware upfront of policies and procedures regarding interacting with policymakers
- HIA practice may look different depending on the approach (e.g., relationship and leverage with decision-makers and/or advocates)

Lessons Learned: Stakeholder Engagement

- Importance of national and diverse Advisory Committee
- Key to engage policymakers on both sides of the debate
- Critical to engage with those potentially affected by the policy decision at a local level, even though the decision may be occurring at the federal level

Implications for HIA Practice

- Flexibility and modification of HIA steps, especially reporting
- Use of innovative assessment and communication methods
- Careful selection of policy target and serious consideration of feasibility of doing HIA on actively debated, contentious federal legislation
