U.S. Immigration: National and State Trends and Actions

Methodology and sources

The share of each state's population that is foreign-born is calculated by dividing the state's foreign-born population by its total population. Likewise, the share of each state's unauthorized residents is found by dividing its unauthorized immigrant population by its total population.

The estimates of the unauthorized population for 1990-2012 were adjusted to include people not counted in the census, and the total population numbers for those years were not adjusted, so the share of each state's unauthorized immigrant population may be slightly overstated. However, any differences are likely to be insignificant, because small increases in the total population would have very little effect on the ratio.

No single source has all the necessary data for every year examined, so Pew researchers consulted several sources to produce the maps in this infographic. Slight differences exist in the data across these sources, as shown in the table.
