1 in 18 adults^{1,2}


is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 128 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 17 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 48); the figure for 1982 was 31 percent (national rank: 24)¹

TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION




COSTS

\$207 million⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 7.3 percent in fiscal year 2008⁶
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Idaho spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 13 cents on probation and parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$61.19) = 15 days of probation and parole⁵
