## **ERRATA**

The following errors were found subsequent to the release of the report *Philadelphia's Crowded, Costly Jails: The Search for Safe Solutions.* They have been corrected in the online version.

These revisions should be noted in the hard copy of the report. The accurate information is in bold. Originally published information appears in the brackets.

## **REPORT**

Page 4, in the last bullet point in the right hand column, the second sentence should now read: In 2009, for the first time in a decade, **new cases accepted by** [not "the caseload of"] the Adult Probation and Parole Department leveled off and, with it, the number of people incarcerated for violations.

Page 17, in the second to last paragraph, the last sentence should now read: From 2004 to 2009, **new cases accepted by** the Philadelphia probation department rose from 19,065 to 26,318 [not "the Philadelphia probation department's caseload..."]

Page 18, the text above figures 3.9 and 3.10 should now read:

As **new** probation and parole **cases** [not "probation and parole caseloads"] rose from 2004 to 2008, so did admissions to jail for probation and parole violations.

Page 18, figure 3.10 should be relabeled:

PHILADELPHIA'S ADULT PROBATION AND PAROLE DEPARTMENT **NEW CASES** [not "CASELOAD."]

Page 28, footnote 55 should read:

"Bench Warrants 2005-2009" (March 2010), provided by the **Santa Cruz County** [not "County of Santa Barbara"] Probation Department.
