1 in 44 adults^{1,2}


is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 87 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 31 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 31); the figure for 1982 was 21 percent (national rank: 43)¹

TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION




COSTS

\$179 million⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 5.1 percent in fiscal year 2008⁶
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Nebraska spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 19 cents on probation and parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$95.48) = 11 days of parole or 45 days of probation⁵
