
is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 79 adults^{1,2}
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 47 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 7); the figure for 1982 was 39 percent (national rank: 11)¹

TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION




COSTS

\$625 million⁶

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 6.4 percent in fiscal year 20086
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Louisiana spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 11 cents on probation and parole⁵
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$39.75) = 15 days of probation and parole⁵
