


The Cost of Delay: State Dental Policies Fail One in Five Children **Colorado**



COLORADO meets five of eight policy benchmarks aimed at addressing children's dental health needs. The state reimburses dentists for Medicaid at a level that falls short of the national average, but the percentage of children on Medicaid seeing a dentist each year exceeded the national average in 2007, the latest year for which data are available. To improve access to care, the state recently approved Medicaid reimbursements to primary care physicians for providing preventive dental services to kids. The state's expansion of its sealant program, Be Smart & Seal Them!, has reached children who are at high risk for tooth decay in both rural and urban areas of the state. But the state just misses the national goal of providing fluoridated water to 75 percent of its population on community water supplies.

HOW BAD IS THE PROBLEM?

TOO MANY CHILDREN LACK ACCESS TO DENTAL CARE, WITH SEVERE OUTCOMES. One measure of the problem: more than half of the children on Medicaid received no dental service in 2007.
