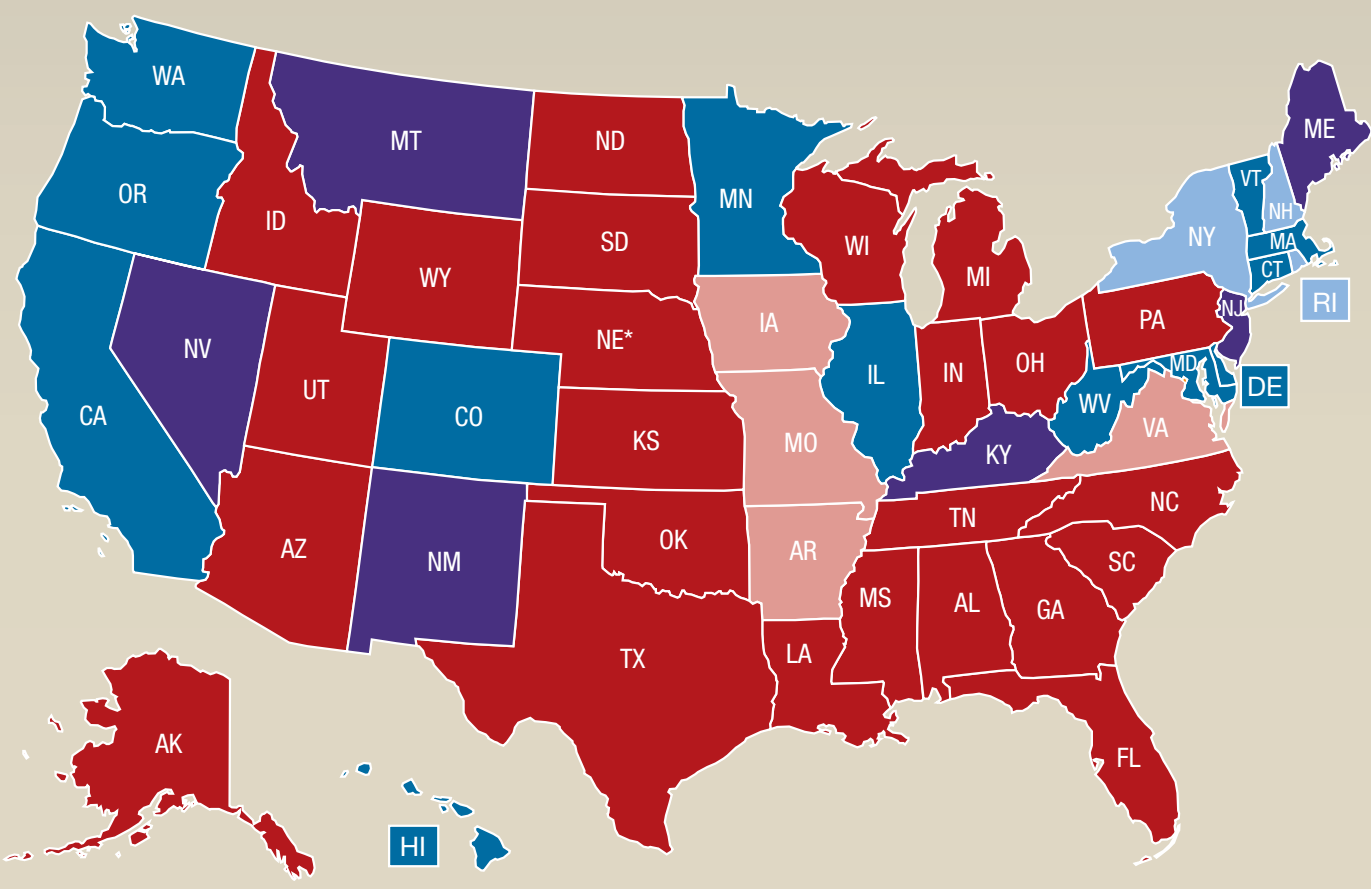

How the states were rated

The Power Index measures the ease with which Democrats and Republicans can pass legislation. To do so, it takes into account the party of the governor, the percentage of Democrats and Republicans in each chamber of the legislature and the state's veto-override threshold. States that are "strongly Democratic" or "strongly Republican" have one-party control of the legislature and governorship. Where control is divided, if one party needs far fewer votes from the opposition to pass legislation, the state "leans" toward that party.

*While Nebraska's unicameral legislature is officially nonpartisan, the *Omaha World-Herald* reported after the election that the membership will be 30 Republicans, 17 Democrats and 2 Independents.
