**POPULATION** 

### 1 in 46 adults<sup>1,2</sup>


is under correctional control

- **Growth over time:** in 1982, the figure was 1 in 73 adults<sup>1,2</sup>
- Percent behind bars: at year end 2007, 23 percent of the correctional population was in prison or jail (national rank: 44); the figure for 1982 was 12 percent (national rank: 51)<sup>1</sup>

#### **TOTAL CORRECTIONAL POPULATION**





## \$116 million<sup>6</sup>

spent on corrections

- Share of general fund: 9.4 percent in fiscal year 20086
- Ratio of spending: For every dollar Vermont spent on prisons in 2008, it spent 23 cents on probation and parole<sup>5</sup>
- Ratio of costs: 1 day of prison (\$122.00) = 18 days of probation and parole<sup>5</sup>
