Meanwhile, this will drive up the cost of a basic necessity for consumers in the middle of the worst recession in decades.

SUPPORTERS of the proposal say Americans have the right to be confident that the food they eat is safe. A lot has changed in the last century but our laws have not kept up. The FDA inspects food processing facilities once every ten years on average, and does not have authority to issue mandatory recalls. Recent outbreaks like salmonella in peanut products show why this legislation is so badly needed. We can protect small farmers and help them stay in business while at the same time making our food safer.
