

...But Support Has Declined among Republicans

- Today, 54% of Republicans say undocumented immigrants "should be allowed to stay legally" in the U.S., down from 64% in February
- Among Tea Party Republicans, the decline was sharper, falling from 56% in February to 41% today.
- Democrats showed a small decline as well—falling from 81% in February to 77% today.




Question: President Obama recently announced a policy that will allow illegal immigrants who were brought to the U.S. as children to remain in the U.S. and apply for work permits. Do you

Registered voters


