
Federal Grants Account for Nearly a Third of State Revenue Share of total by category, state FY 2016



Notes: "Taxes" are any taxes imposed or collected by the states, including income, sales, and property taxes. "Federal grants" are revenue received from the federal government, including funding for programs in areas such as health care, education, transportation, and payments in lieu of taxes on federal property. "Service charges" are funds received for specific services provided, such as public university tuition, tolls, or fees from public hospitals. "Other" includes miscellaneous revenue not included in the other categories, such as property sales and fines, as well as revenue from local governments. These four categories make up the Census Bureau's general revenue figure, which excludes revenue
