



The Pew Charitable Trusts and Harvard Dental School Dental Access Survey

Topline Report • September 18, 2018

The survey was conducted for The Pew Charitable Trusts and Harvard School of Dental Medicine via telephone (landline and cell) by SSRS, an independent research company. Interviews were conducted from August 1 to September 9, 2018, among a representative random sample of 828 total respondents (423 with dental coverage through Medicaid and 405 with dental coverage through a private insurer) from 33 states, plus the District of Columbia, which are areas where Medicaid offers a dental benefit that provides more than just emergency care. The margin of error with design effect for the total respondents is +/-5 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence level. The margin of error with design effect for the Medicaid sample is +/-5.8 percentage points and the privately insured sample is +/-6 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence interval. DENT19. I'd like to ask you about dental therapists. These are dental care providers who give routine care, and are similar to physician assistants or nurse practitioners in medicine.
